1973

Quicklaw Incorporated

1985

is acquired from CCH Canadian Limited and re-branded as Canadian Case Summaries which are then integrated with links to full text cases.

The collection of law reviews and journals is expanded over time to include thousands of Canadian and International legal journals.

1993

Quicklaw Inc. acquires CanCite

which becomes QuickCite® and is integrated with its court judgments collection.

1995

In-house Consolidation of Statutes

is launched with the Ontario Statutes and expanded later to include all jurisdictions.

1996

Current awareness NetLetter® Issues Collection is launched

with NetLetter® – Alan D. Gold's Criminal Law Issues being one of the first available.

2001

Quicklaw is now available as a Web Version instead of software

2002

Halsbury's® Laws of Canada legal encyclopedia

launched and recognized as the premier legal reference in the world for common law.

2006

Juris Classeur™ Québec launches in Montréal

The new series of French-language encyclopedias is modelled after those in France and Monaco.

2008

LexisNexis® E-Books and Quicklaw app for Iphone® is launched

in Canada gives legal professionals access to trusted research information around the clock from any location.

2011

Quicklaw for Microsoft® Office launched in Canada

Developed in partnership with Microsoft this software integrates research directly into desktop applications.

2012

Lexis Practice Advisor® launched (now Practical Guidance)

Combines exclusive new practical, "how-to" content written by leading practitioners from across Canada.

LexisNexis acquires Wolters Kluwer legal publications portfolio.
