## What is CaseViewNet?

CaseViewNet gives you interactive access to real-time testimony through a court reporter's private Wi-Fi network. That means no cables to hook up, drivers to install, etc. And since the CaseViewNet client software is **free**, there are no tokens to purchase, no royalties to pay, and no compliance issues to worry about. You are free to concentrate on the important matters at hand.

Basically, once you download CaseViewNet, you will simply connect to the court reporter's Wi-Fi network (just like sitting at Starbucks!), and then you can receive the transcript feed from the court reporter. You can annotate, mark and search the transcripts in CaseViewNet – and there's a **Send to TextMap** button. So once you get the live feed, you can send the transcript **and** the annotations right to TextMap to start working on it as usual. That's it!

The other feature that sets CaseViewNet apart is RapidRefresh. RapidRefresh allows court reporters to make editing changes during the day and have it reflected on lawyers' computers, instantly. So, at the end of the day, all computers connected to the reporter's Wi-Fi network get a refreshed copy of the transcript. RapidRefresh is of a higher quality than a regular serial live feed, plus the lawyer can even join in late and still get the full text of the transcript.

## What if my court reporter doesn't have CaseViewNet?

Not to worry! You can still receive a real-time transcript feed, as long as the court reporter is able to provide a "**serial feed**," which is the industry standard. This means your court reporter can use whatever program they're already familiar with, but you can receive the live feed in your free copy of CaseViewNet. Once the examination is over, you can send that transcript from CaseViewNet straight into TextMap to continue working as usual. So, if your reporter doesn't have CaseViewNet, you just won't be able to connect via Wi-Fi, and you won't get the Rapid Refresh feature either – but, you can still get the serial feed, and get the benefit of walking out of the examination with the transcript right at your fingertips!
