- Commentary Referring to this Case

**C** Get the big picture on Citing Cases. Under Citing Cases, you can access and review a graphical representation of citing cases in context by Treatment, Court, Year and Jurisdiction.

**D** The alert is triggered by a major change that will impact the signal.

**E** Familiar icons let you print, download, email or save reports to a Folder, or deliver report specifics. For example, you can hide signals, history of case, citing cases or commentary.

**F** Review what each signal indicator means by clicking on the link to QuickCITE signal help.

**G** Copy the full-case citation for your work, including parallel citations and a link to the full-text case.

**H** Navigate quickly to the different parts of the QuickCITE record.
