

## Start Your Search: Red Search Box

When you log-in to Lexis Advance Quicklaw, the following landing page displays:

- A** Return to this home page at any time by clicking on the Lexis Advance Quicklaw logo on any screen.
- B** Browse sources or legal topics. Click Browse, then select Sources or Legal Topics. Drill down through the hierarchy or search for specific sources or topics.
- C** Change/edit client matter IDs.
- D** View recent searches or retrieved documents. Your history is also accessible through the History pod below the red search box.
- E** Access Folders, Alerts, and Notifications.

**F** Enter your search words to find sources and more!  
Simply enter:

- A natural language search, then click Search. No source selection is necessary (e.g., occupier's liability).
- A terms and connector search (e.g., disability/20 alcohol! ), then click Search.
- A citation (e.g., 2005scj65), then click Search to retrieve the full-text document as well as search results for that citation.
- A partial or full source title (e.g., Copyright Board), then click Search to find a source title to add to your search or to retrieve the source's documents.
- A case name (e.g., Demoor v. Harvey), then click Search to retrieve the full-text document as well as any search results for that case.
- A statute name (e.g., Bridges Act), then click Search to retrieve the full-text document as well as search results for that statute.
- NoteUp with QuickCITE® request (e.g., cit:2005 scj 65), then click Search.

As you type, the red search box offers suggested legal phrases, documents and sources.

**G** Refine your search upfront and filter by jurisdiction, content category, or practice area and topic — or get help with terms & connectors. Click Recent & Favourites to open recent sources, filters or topics. You can also filter your search results.

**H** Access content in a focused way and automatically scope your search results by clicking on a link in Explore Content.

**I** Get there quicker! Use these pods for fast access to favorite sources, Folders, Alerts and legal topic update notifications. A blue dot means that item has new information. The pods also offer access to Help topics and new Lexis Advance Quicklaw updates.
