


# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS INTERNATIONAL CONTENT SHARING

## 1. What is International Content Sharing?

International Content Sharing utilizes flags to provide access to the international content. Countries included via the International Content Sharing feature, are the US, the UK (82 titles, representing 97.3% of the UK most popular sources), Australia, New Zealand and Hong Kong. Additional international content, including more UK titles, and the introduction of France content, will continue to be made available via International Content Sharing (country flags) throughout the 2018-2019 Academic year.

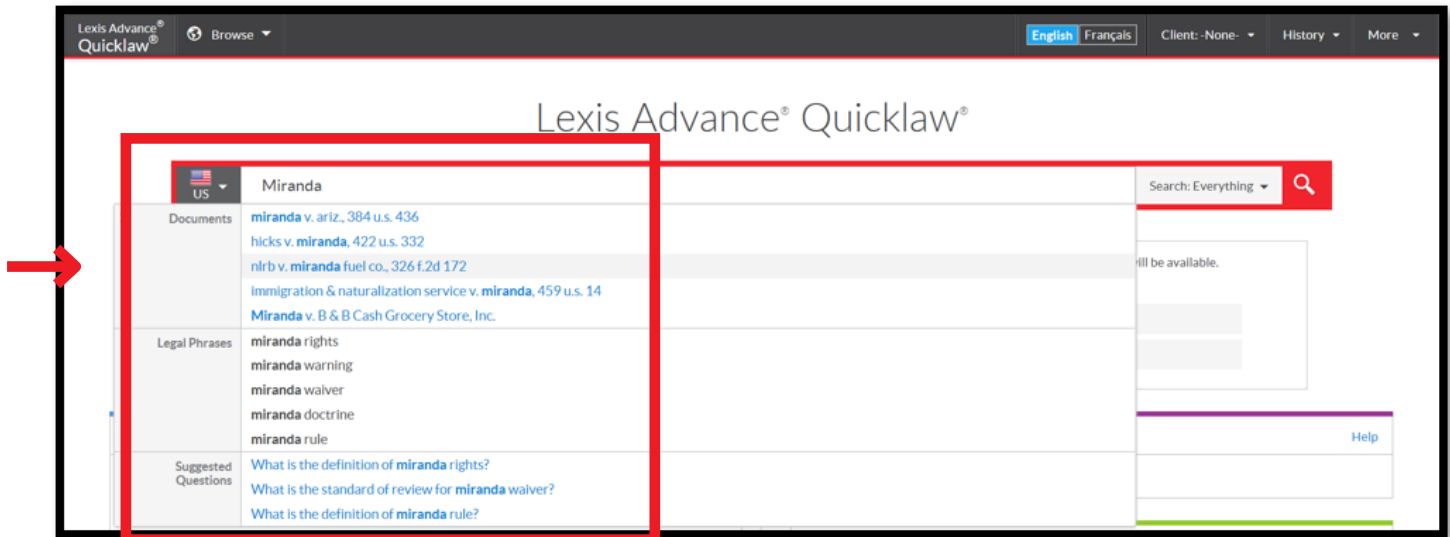

## 2. How do I access International Content?

Accessing International Content on Lexis Advance Quicklaw is fast-and-easy.

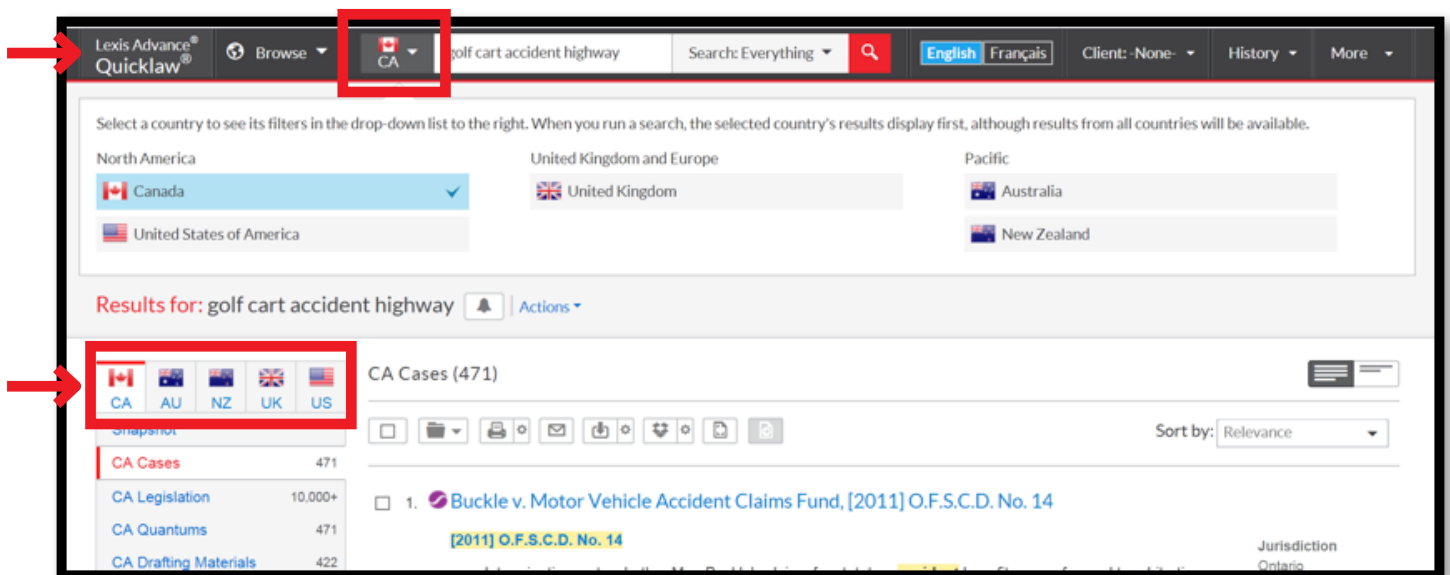
1. A new flag system has been introduced to the Big Red Search Box. By default the Canadian Flag is displayed.
2. Click the Canadian Flag to view flags for other countries. Note only countries whose content is available on the Lexis Advance platform will be displayed.
3. Simply select the flag for the country you would like to search, and then enter your search string in the Big Red Search Box. In the example below, we've selected the US flag. Note that as we begin to enter the case name **Miranda v. Arizona** the word-wheel begins to offer suggestions.



## 3. Can I toggle between countries?

Yes, once you run a search in one country, simply select a different flag to re-run the search in another country.

In the example below, we searched for the terms *golf cart accident highway* in Canada. Run the same search in the US content by using the country flags visible in the upper left results panel; or alternately by using the flag drop-down option in the Big Red Search Box and clicking the magnifying glass to re-run the search.

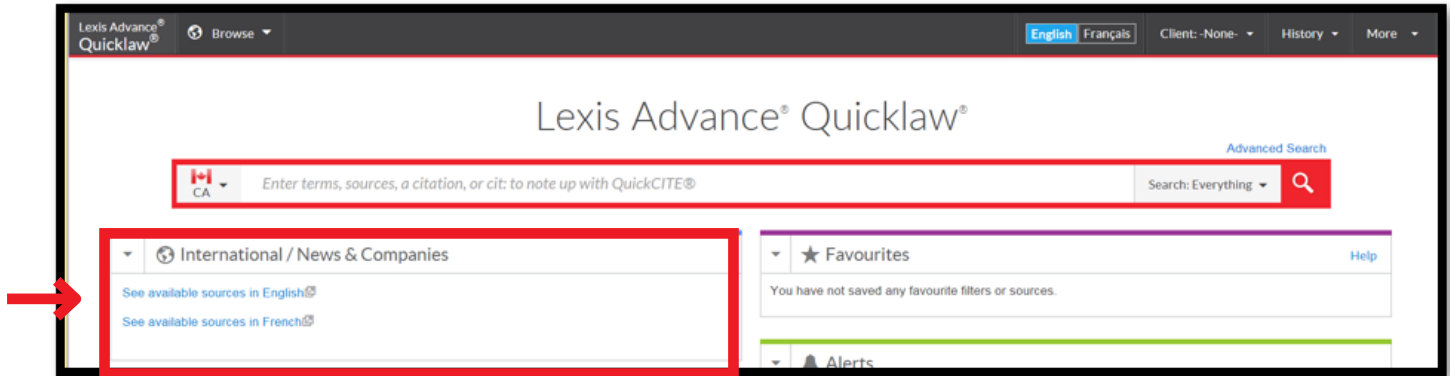


#### 4. Will all my International Content be available via the International Content SharingFlags?

International Content for the US, the UK (82 titles, representing 97.3% of the UK most popular sources), Australia, New Zealand and Hong Kong are currently being offered via the flag system. Additional international content will be made available as each host country adds its content to the Lexis Advance Platform.

#### 5. What if I need content that is not available via International Content Sharing?

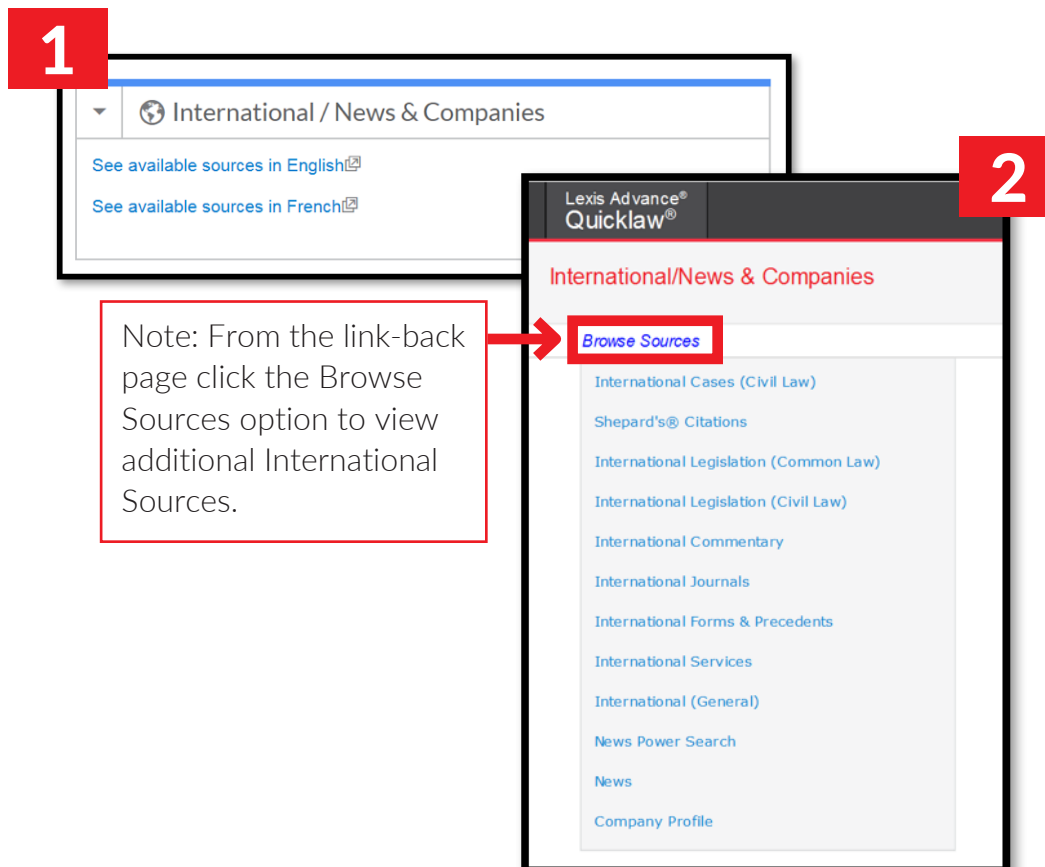
A link-back option to Quicklaw will continue to be provided via the **International/News & Companies** pod.



#### 6. How does the link-back option work?

The international link-back option can be accessed via the International/News & Companies pod on the Lexis Advance Quicklaw Home Page.

1. Simply click **See available sources in English** or **See available sources in French** and you will be taken to a page that allows you to select the **Browse Sources** option or a content source by type from the list provided.
2. This link-back option simply opens a new browser tab and allows you to search or browse additional international content on Quicklaw.



## 7. I selected the International link-back option and see a sign-in page, which ID and Password do I enter?

## 8. Will I need to enter my Quicklaw password each time I use the International link-back?

No, simply check the box “**Remember Me**”, the first time you select this option to bypass the log-in page in the future. We recommend this approach.

## 9. Will I still continue to have access to all the sources I could previously access in Quicklaw?

Yes, and more. The building blocks used to provide international content to our users has been expanded to include far more sources than previously available on Quicklaw.

## 10. JurisClasseur – France is a source we use extensively. Will this be available via International Content Sharing?

France is not currently offering their content on the Lexis Advance platform. A project is currently underway to bring this content onto Lexis Advance Quicklaw. In the interim, this content will continue to be offered via a link-back option to Quicklaw.
