There's a reason why Australia has been reluctant to view no-poach agreements and noncomplete clauses as an antitrust issue. Since 1974, labor issues have been excluded from the country's competition law, meaning that employers have been able to legally fix wages and collude on who they can employ. That may be about to change, with the country's competition minister saying he's ready to bring labor arrangements under the purview of the Competition and Consumer Act. And if Canada's recent experience is anything to go by, employer collusion may not just be banned — it could be criminalized.
