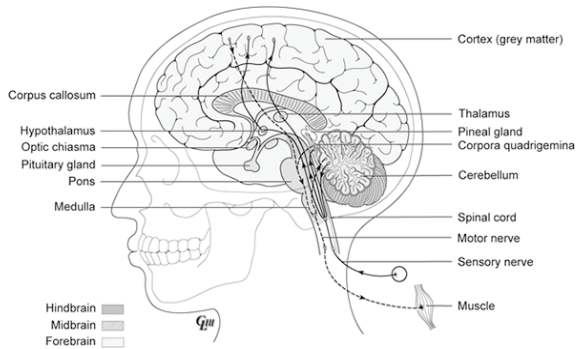

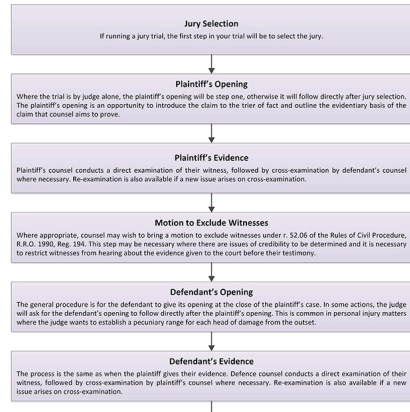


Flowcharts

Order of Proceedings at Trial

The order of procedure at trial is governed by r. 52.07(1) of the Rules of Civil Procedure, R.R.O. 1990, Reg. 194, but below is an outline of the general anatomy of a trial. Note there might be slight variations in procedure, depending on the direction of the judge hearing the trial and whether the trial is heard by a judge alone or by a judge and jury. Furthermore, r. 52.07(2) states that the trial judge may reverse the order of presentation where the burden of proof in respect of all matters in issue lies with the defendant.
