

# **Smart Charts**



Smart Charts are a smarter way to digest large amounts of information and provide you with a topic search tree view of the document. You can expand the tree, often multiple levels deep, until you get to the section of the document that you want. Below is a breakdown of the Smart Charts available in different modules.

## How to Use Smart Charts

Smart Charts provide information in a tree view. Step one: expand the tree to locate the information you want. For example, in the Intestacy Provisions Smart Chart, the tree was expanded by clicking on the arrows to get to the No Spouse or Issue clause as shown below:
